After their Aylmerton trip, Mrs Sara Hewitt, a highly experienced Y6 teacher will be with class 8 to pretty much the end of the academic year. I have had the privilege of working with Sara at The Icknield Primary School and I know that the children will get on very well with her. This means that Mrs Webb will no longer be able to teach in class 2. Mr Lennon has agreed to teach an additional morning (Thursday) and Mrs Rootes will teach the children on Thursday afternoon and Friday until the end of the academic year. We apologise again for the disruption this class have faced this year, due to events beyond our control but we are extremely pleased with the relationship the children have built with Mr Lennon and the progress they are making under his guidance.


Year 6 ENO Music Project

Our year 6 pupils have recently finished a fantastic, creative project with English National Opera. Through the project each class worked collaboratively to develop their ideas and compose their own colour world to 'Finish' a piece of music called 'Blue, Red, Yellow ...'. This work helped us to learn about the role of the librettist, who writes the words for opera, to overcome some of the barriers attached to this style of music, and learn directly from the composer Omar Shahryah. Attendance

Pleasingly, our overall school attendance figure is up compared with this time last year. Currently, our overall school attendance sits at 95.2% compared with 94.2% at this point last year. Our hope is to continue this upward trajectory as we move into the second half of the academic year. This overall improvement is in no small part, down to your hard work and support in getting your child into school, every day, on time which is much appreciated. The available research in this area clearly shows the correlation between good school attendance (above 90%) and positive outcomes at KS2 SATs – end of Y6.
