

We are changing how we look at home learning, below you will find some opportunities to extend the learning we are doing in class. If you complete a piece of learning, please bring it into class where we can display it and share what you have done. Also, if you would like to write about something you have done or are passionate about which isn't on the menu then please do so.

SPaG CGP: All pupils should complete their SPaG activities in your booklet and mark them at home. This activity should not take more than 15 minutes and please do not do more than 4 pages. Completed activities should be brought into school every Tuesday.

Reading

- Choose a chapter from the book you are reading and create a 'graphic novel' chapter.
- From the point that we are at during Goodnight Mr Tom, predict what you think will happen to Will.
- Using the book that you are reading or have just finished, write a diary entry from one of the characters when they are facing a difficult decision or a challenging moment.

PE

- Think about one of the swimming strokes we have been looking at and explain to a non-swimmer, with the aid of diagrams, how this stroke can be learned.
- Design a poster about water safety. What is important? What should you do and what should you not do?*

Science

- Develop your own classification key.
- Why is an owl not a fish? Why is a monkey not an insect? Explain classification in a way that a 5 year old would understand.
- Write about the journey of blood around the body from the perspective of the blood.



R.E

- How do you believe the world was created? Can you draw illustrations to support your explanation?
- Choose a faith and explain how the world was created from this faith's perspective. How did you research? Did you find any helpful websites?

Art/DT

- Find out about ingenious ways of cooking with rations.
- Create the Alps mountains range using craft
- Research the different shelters used during the war. Can you build a model of one?

English / History

- Find out how German children were affected by World War 2 and write about it.
- Research how children's novels about wars have been transferred to the stage or screen.
- Describe the differences and similarities between British and European mountain ranges
- Develop your own war poem like we have been doing in class. Don't forget to use figurative and emotive language. *
- Find information about the different types of planes used in World War 2 and write a report about it using diagrams.

Other Activities

- Make a friendship bracelet using some string, wool, beads and other small items.
- Make a certificate for a friend to celebrate one of their special qualities or an achievement.
- Complete a 'random act of kindness' by doing something nice for a friend or a stranger anonymously (if possible).
- Write a thank you letter to somebody to show your appreciation for a gift or something that the recipient has done for you.
