Year 6 expectations


- Responsibility your possessions and having everything you need before the day begins.

English: Writing

- Jane Considine's "The Write Stuff"
- Main focus in lessons is on writing: developing maturity of composition, sentence structure, punctuation, handwriting and spelling.
- Building towards independent writing based on previous learning.



English: Reading

- Whole class reading for 30 minutes, three times weekly. Fourth session based around the love of reading.
- Individual reading to adults in school.



English: SPaG

- Spelling, punctuation and grammar.
- Spellings are taught and practised in school 3x weekly
- SPaG Homelearning 15 mins a week
- Punctuation and grammar taught discretely in English lessons.
- Vocabulary Spellington Wellington/ WOW wall words.
- SPaG after school sessions in the Spring term.

Home learning
