### Ceilidh - Changes to timing - Update

The children may have mentioned to you that we have slightly tweaked the timings within the school day to maximise learning time. Because of this, we have moved our Ceilidh (celebration assembly) to 8:55am on a Friday morning. It normally lasts about half an hour. Not all children attend Ceilidh every week. One week is Upper School (Year 5 and 6) and the next is Lower School (Year 3 and 4). Check the newsletter each week to find out whose Ceilidh is coming up!

### Spelling

One of our school priorities this year is spelling. We will be teaching weekly spelling rules but won't be sending home word lists to learn. The evidence is clear that these have little or no impact on children's spelling abilities. You can support your child's spelling by focusing on the statutory spelling words for your child's particular year group. There is one list for Year 3 & 4 and one for Year 5 & 6. They can be found on the year group web page - just make sure you scroll down!

### Maths home learning

All children now have Mathletics logins in their reading records/planners. They will be set 2 or 3 activities each week to complete and then they are free to complete any of the other activities they can find. The first of each colour certificate that children earn will be awarded in Ceilidh. Year 6 have already been given a maths workbook to complete as home learning on a weekly basis. This is in addition to Mathletics.

Every child also has a TT Rockstars login for practising their times tables. Please support children rehearsing at home. It is expected that children know all of their tables up to 12 x 12 by the end of Year 4.

### Recording child absence link



#### Forest School

One of the big advantages of moving the timing of Ceilidh is that Forest School sessions can be in a block. Children will have four sessions in a row on a Friday afternoon. Keep an eye on the newsletter for which class's sessions are coming up. On a Forest School Day, children need to bring in long sleeves, long trousers and appropriate waterproof layers/footwear. Forest school happens in all weathers!

If your child's class has Forest School, this will replace their PE lesson for that week. To clarify, your child will not need to attend in their PE kit on their specific PE day until after their Forest School sessions have finished.
