Year 6 Curriculum Newsletter

Spring Term

English: We will be focussing on non-fiction writing at the start of this term, we will be exploring Goodnight stories for Rebel girls and writing our own biographies of historically significant people. Our poetry writing will be centred about our science topic of Evolution and we will explore the port Philip Gross. Our class books will be Wildboy by Rob Lloyd Jones and High Rise Mystery by Sharna Jackson.

Art:

In art we will be developing photography skills and techniques to design a range of creative photographic outcomes

Geography:

We will be exploring hot desert biomes and learning about the physical features of a desert and how humans interact with this environment.

PSHE:

This unit will focus on exploring: attitudes to money, how to keep money safe, career paths and the variety of different jobs available

Enrichment:

This half term our children will be taking part in a safer internet day.

PF:

PE will consist of children taking part in football. The class teacher will teach gymnastics for the other lesson.

Maths: At the start of this term, the children are continuing working on their decimals. We will be introducing two new areas of maths in this term: algebra and ratio and proportion. We will finish the term discovering scaling and geometry.

RE: In RE, we will be thinking back to learning about prayer and worship, children find out about significant religious and non-religious journeys and pilgrimages and why going to a particular place is so important to some people.



History:

Science:

In science. Year 6 will be studying patterns in humans and other species, children learn about characteristics that are inherited and those that are environmental. Through the eyes of Darwin and Wallace, pupils understand how observations lead to theories.

Computing:

We will completing work on eSafety as part of Safer Internet Day. We will also be looking at "Big Data" and how it can be secured, stored and analysed.
