


Forest School will be a Monday afternoon. Class 7 sessions will be in February/March. Class 8 sessions will be March/April.




Uniform

Food and Drink




If children want a snack at break time, this must be brought in from home. This must be a healthy snack so fruit or a cereal bar is acceptable. No nuts.



SPaG: Children will be given a workbook to work through and mark at their own pace (maximum 4 pages per week).


Maths: Children will be expected to complete activities that are set on Mathletics each week. Working out should be completed in the Maths Home Learning book, if needed.




