## COSTUMES

**PETER PAN**Traditional green outfit with pockets or pouch for fairy dust/acorn necklace.

**WENDY**Long nightgown (old-fashioned if possible). Add a foliage necklace/headband when she

has spent some time in Neverland.

JOHN/MICHAEL Old-fashioned pyjamas for both of them and a top hat for John. They will also need

simple jackets.

MR DARLING Dark-coloured suit (and a tie is added during Song 1).

MRS DARLING Smart long skirt, blouse and shawl.

**TINKERBELL** Traditional-style fairy outfit with wings, but in forest colours. If possible, she should have a

light around her neck, which can be switched on and off, and some bells on her skirt or shoes.

**CAPTAIN HOOK** Smart Pirate Captain outfit with a more elaborate hat than anyone else and a large hook.

He needs an extra ornate hat later in the play.

**PIRATES** (Including the named pirates) Traditional pirate outfits with the occasional eye patch.

All pirates need cutlasses/swords.

SHIP'S COOK

An apron and perhaps a chef's hat with a skull and crossbones on.

LOST BOYS

T-shirts/shorts in forest colours with some foliage added. They will also need simple jackets.

WILD WARRIORS They could wear outfits of the same colour and have 'wild hair' achieved with hair gel. The

Chief and Tiger Lily could add a crown/tiara respectively to their wild hairdos, and gold

sashes around their waists.

MERMAIDS Lots of sparkle and shine! Break out the neon leotards and add bling! Tails can be achieved

by using a long skirt gathered in at the bottom with a fin-like frill added.

NANA Dog-coloured top and leggings with a doggy mask or face paints. Doggy ears and a tail

would be perfect. If possible, Nana should also wear an old-fashioned nanny-type cap and

small apron.

**CROC** Green top and trousers/leggings, with a crocodile head mask and a pointed tail added.

Long black skirt, white blouse and apron.

**SHADOW**Black trousers and a black top with hood.

**FAIRIES** Fairy outfits with wings, in a variety of forest colours.

Please note that props may be used in more than one scene, but are only ascribed to the initial scene in which they appear. Please see notes on **Staging** in the **Director's Assistant Section (pages 8-9)** for ideas on how to set up each scene with additional props.
