Dear Parent / Carer,

Year 6 are working on our parts for the school Christmas Church Services. Children have chosen how they would like to participate, and your child has chosen to be part of a 'tableau' (still picture) as part of our re-telling of the Christmas Story.

Character in Tableau:

<u>Your child will need a simple costume</u> for this, and we are asking for as much help as possible. Please see below for guidance and suggestions. <u>If you have any difficulty with this, please talk to us as soon as possible and by 5th <u>December at the latest.</u> Your child will need their costume in school, in a named carrier bag, from MONDAY 8th DECEMBER please.</u>

Costume suggestions:

Mary – Light Blue / white / pale colour dress or top and skirt or tunic. Head scarf / covering

Joseph – brown or dark coloured plain long sleeved top (long if possible) with a belt or rope tied around the waist, over dark trousers

Angel – white / silver clothes and accessories (wings optional!!). Tinsel or similar in hair.

Donkey – grey, dark trousers and jumper or long sleeved top. Ears on a headband (school can make these) Sheep – white and warm!

Shepherd – tunic or a long oversized top, tied with a belt or rope around the middle. Pastel colours & brown. Head scarf optional. Soft toy sheep / crook also optional

King – bright primary colours (red, blue, yellow) – shiny if possible. A cloak or bright (non patterned) material tied over shoulders. (school can make crowns and gifts)

Star holder – the star needs to move, and will be carried by star holders. Children can wear school uniform for this, or embrace the opportunity to dress up and be shiny!

Some children are also narrators. If your child has both parts (tableau and narrator), they will read their narrator words whilst dressed in their costume.

Church Services take place on Monday 15th December (Granta/Rivey) and Tuesday 16th December (Chilford/Simmons). Costumes need to be warm enough to wear under a coat when walking to, and sitting in, St Mary's Church (so layers underneath are very much needed, or a costume can be worn on top of school uniform).
